

## **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS FOR SPECIAL/ADVANCED TOPICS SUMMER II 2010**

**COIN 480 –62 TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION FOR SCIENTISTS (3). Prerequisites: COIN 235 .** Introduction to the principles of technical communications. Topics shall include determining the audience and purpose of the communication, construction of technical and professional memorandums and emails, technical documentation including test procedures and users' guides, technical oral presentations and interview skills.

**COMM 480 – 01 ADVANCE ACTING (3). Prerequisite: COMM 321.** This special topic course will feature an interactive learning environment where students will have the opportunity to develop further their acting skills. Students will build upon their basic acting skills learned in COMM 321 by supplementing their acting knowledge of Stanislavski with the newer theories of Suzuki, Lecoq and Laban. These theories emphasize techniques of movement to amplify the text in performance. This course will involve readings and exercises demonstrating these theories. Students will prepare and present an acting scene for the final project that will be rehearsed and performed multiple times over Fall semester. **Approved for major or minor credit for Communication (Theatre emphasis ), or as a general elective credit.**

**CRIM 280-40 DRUGS AND THE CJ SYSTEM (3).** Introductory course that provides basic information about the problems of alcohol and other drug abuse. Explores symptoms and effects of abuse and dependence on individuals, families and society. **Approved for major or minor credit in Criminal Justice or as a general elective credit.**

**CRIM 595-01 INTERNSHIP ATLANTA (3). Prerequisite: Acceptance to the Master's Criminal Justice program and approval by Dr. Fish.** The course will consist of observations of a local agency, a one-week field experience in Atlanta, GA., group meetings, and assigned readings. Arrangements for assignments, work hours, and working conditions must meet with the mutual satisfaction of the student, the supervising professor, the department chairperson, and the agency.
